St Camillus de Lellis (1550-1614) Patron of the Sick, Hospitals and Promoters of Health



Camillus de Lillis, the founder and patron of the order, was born on May 25, 1550 at Bucchianico in Italy. Following his father in a military career over the course of many years, he lived recklessly with compulsion for gambling. In 1575, at the age of 25, Camillus experienced a spiritual conversion and resolved to reform his life and dedicate himself to the service of God. Still afflicted by the wound on his right leg, he had a divine inspiration to assemble a group of good men willing to dedicate themselves to the sick, and this group is known as "Ministers of the Infirm." Camillus chose Red Cross as the

distinguishing badge for the members of his Order. After leading the movement throughout Italy he dies on July 14, 1614. In 1746, Camillus was canonized by Pope Benedict XIV as the patron of the sick and those who serve them.

Senhasadan is a compressive care and support centre for people living with HIV, belongs to the Order of the Ministers of the Infirm (MI), an International Faith Based Organization (FBO) that has been involving in the health care for more than 450 years. Snehasadan, the 65-bedded centre has been a Home of love for people living with HIV, since 2001. Snehasadan, is the third a Camillians-India initiative under Sneha Charitable Trust. It is also a care Home for Orphan and Vulnerable Children. Snehasadan provides them a platform to grow and build the future, with love care and Compassion.

Services at Snehasadan

There are infected Adults and Children from age below one to twenty in our care and support program. Snehasadan aims at comprehensivelyaddressing the multiple issues of infected children to prepare them for productive and constructive life.

1. Infected Adults and rehabilitation

Snehasadan was founded for HIV infected persons. Now the flow of adults are reduced. A few of them are rehabilitated staff in the care of children.

T.B – **HIV cases and treatment:** all throughout the year we have patients in this category which is a challenging task in the service of the society.

2. OVC (Orphan and Vulnerable Children)

OVC component was added to Snehasadan 16 years ago and the centre is registered under under CWC. (Registration is for the age group 6-18)

3. OVC below Six

The centre also take care of infected Children under the age six. There are three children in this category at present. Snehasadan opened its door for them at the request of officials from CWC, Mangalore and District Child Protection Unit..

Highlights of Snehasadan

- Besides the above there are eight children who continue at Snehasadan after the age of 18. Five are pursuing their college studies and three are rehabilitated under special skill training *like Driving, Computer and Candle Making*.
- Mentally challenged or differently abled children with behavioural issues who does not go to the school are given day care at the centre.
- We organize programmes for our children in the extended families engaged in studies and work *like motivational classes, guidance, medical check up supportive gestures of various kind.*



Since the last decade and a half, Snehasadan has been doling out pure love and unadulterated compassion, in more doses than any other health care institution that I have had the good fortune to experience. The Ministers of the Infirm (popularly known as Camillians)

team– led by the Director, Fr. Teji, along with the other administrators, brothers, sisters, counselors and support staff – weaves its magic through the universal and eternal language of loving care, which flows from their hearts and hands, unbidden, by some greater unseen spiritual force. Children of all ages, from all over India – either orphaned or abandoned – find in Snehasadan the last bastion of hope, where they rekindle their faith in a benevolent and loving God. Irrespective of caste, creed or religion, Snehasadan embraces, anyone who is in need of the milk of human kindness, and once accepted in the family, all are given equal and unrequited, tender affection.

Completely run and managed on the benevolent donations of well-wishers, the care for orphan and vulnerable children and a few adults living with HIV is holistic and comprehensive. Qualified nurses and counselors are available round the clock – 24/7 – to look after the health needs. Food and nutrition, so essential a component of health care and very often a neglected one, is managed by an in-house kitchen staff, supervised by the administrators. A doctor is available on call to provide timely assistance to the nurses. Specialists in internal medicine, Psychiatry and dermatology pay frequent visits to Snehasadan and provide for specialized care. The children receive daily physical exercise, under the oversight of a physiotherapist. Children are allowed to pursue their faith through meditation and prayer sessions.

I feel privileged and fortunate to be associated with Snehasadan for the last thirteen years. Though the team at Snehasadan feels I have given great service to them, the truth of the matter is that I have received far more than I have given. Every time I experience firsthand the loving and compassionate care here at Snehasadan, I gain the opportunity to rid myself of all the accumulated cynicism and skepticism. Every time I depart from Snehasadan, I leave a rejuvenated soul, ready to face the vicissitudes that Life is bound to throw at me. Snehasadan gives me the hope to continue my efforts, knowing that all is not lost for the future of humanity.


Chritmas Celebration
