St. Camillus de Lellis is the Founder and Patron of the Order of the Ministers of the Infirm. Born on May 25, 1550 at Bucchianico in Italy, Camillus was a genius divinely enlightened in the virtue of charity. The way he served the sick marked a turning point in the healthcare world. The brotherhood he founded provides leadership in healthcare throughout the world today. Camillus chose a red cross as the distinguishing badge for the members of his Order. After leading the movement throughout Italy, Camillus died on July 14, 1614. In 1742, Pope Benedict XIV proclaimed Camillus blessed; in 1746 he canonized him, calling him the "Founder of a new school of charity".
